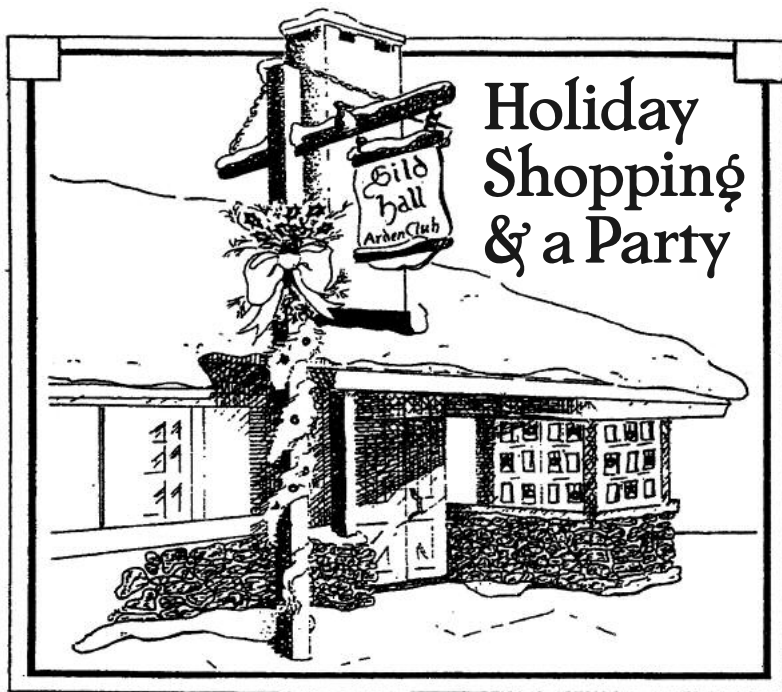

Sustainable Landscapes

A How-To Guide
Monday, November 16, 7:30 p.m.
in Lower Gild Hall

The Gardener's Gild meeting will begin with a half-hour planning session to discuss activities, topics, and speakers for the coming year. Please bring your suggestions. Also in that first half hour, bulbs will be available for sale.

At 8:00 p.m., we will welcome to our meeting Susan Barton, PhD, Assistant Professor and Extension Specialist, Dept. of Plant and Soil Sciences, University of Delaware, who will speak about Sustainable Landscapes. This talk will explore how we can manage soils to create or maintain a functioning soil ecosystem. It will cover strategies, such as green roofs and rain gardens to promote infiltration and maintain integrity of the watershed. Planting recommendations will focus on developing plant communities that serve as a foundation for a healthy ecosystem. Recommendations will be provided to manage resources and materials efficiently by reducing material needs, reusing materials generated onsite, and recycling materials as much as possible. Finally, we will explore how we can use the landscape to reconnect people to nature.



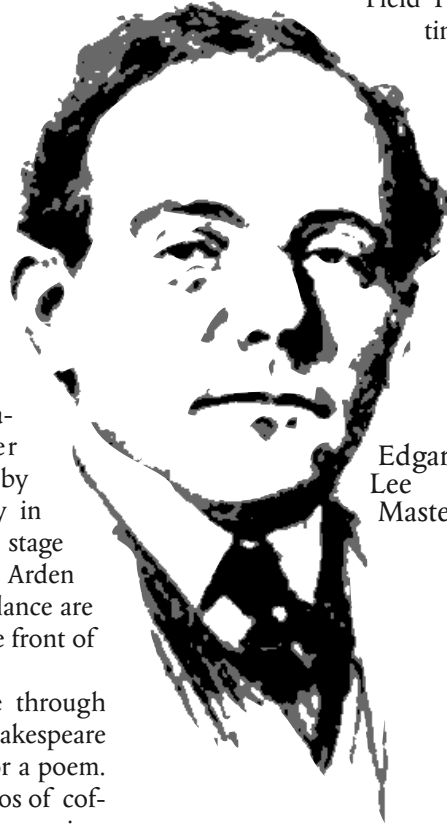
Join us for a community reading of Edgar Lee Masters’ poetic portrait of an American town, much like our own. Published in 1915, *Spoon River Anthology* was a favorite with early Arden settlers. It is a collection of 244 poetic monologues spoken by the deceased residents of a fictional Midwest town. From their graves, the “actors” speak their own epitaphs, “discovering and confessing the real motivations of their lives.” *Spoon River Anthology* was adapted for the stage by Charles Aidman and ran on Broadway in 1963. Our *Spoon River* will not be a stage production, but will resemble our own Arden memorial services, where those in attendance are invited to speak from their seats or at the front of the room as they want.
